Beginning her musical studies at an early age, she graduated from the Nizhny Novgorod Conservatory in Russia and the Ecumenical Institute of Church Music in Berlin, Germany, majoring in Organ and Musicology. In 2009 she moved to the Bay Area with her husband, Alex, and is currently a Principal Organist at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Berkeley. She has performed internationally - in Russia, Germany, Sweden, the Netherlands, and the US. She appeared in concert programs with Kensington Symphony, Auburn Symphony, 'Music in the Mountains' Choir and Orchestra, and in American Guild of Organists members recitals. Her local solo performances include St. Mary's Cathedral and the Legion of Honor museum in San Francisco.
